We have received a certificate to say that we raised £206.97 for Children in Need. Thank you to Miss Beavis and all those who helped raise that money to support children across the UK.


Martlets Snailspace 2018

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Internet Use

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It has come to our attention that there are a number of children who have YouTube accounts and are posting videos of themselves online. We understand why children enjoy doing this but it is very unsafe as these videos are not private – anyone can see them. Some postings have been inappropriate – it is really important that parents are aware of what their children are doing online and it is ok for you to check their devices. Please note that the age restriction for YouTube is 13 so no children at Primary School should be using it – please see <u>https://www.net-aware.org.uk/networks/youtube/</u> for further information.

Attendance

We now have an Attendance Officer, Jackie Storey, who will be working with families who have poor attendance.

Unfortunately, we have had a number of unauthorised absences this term so far. Please can we remind you that if your child is too unwell to attend school, you must contact the school office before 10am on the day of absence. If you do not contact the school, your child's absence will be marked as 'unauthorised'. If your child has 3 or more days of 'unauthorised' absence during any six-week period, they will be referred to the Local Authority for a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Illness

Most childhood illnesses can be dealt with by over-the-counter medicine which should enable your child to attend school that same day. Children **can** come to school if they are tired, feeling generally unwell or have a headache, cold or sore throat. We will **always** contact you if your child is too unwell to be in school and needs to go home.

If your child has diarrhoea and/or vomiting, they must be absent from school for 48 hours to stop any infection spreading to other children. Most children should not have multiple episodes or diarrhoea or vomiting during the school year and so if this is happening frequently, you will be invited for a meeting.

Please also be aware that if your child is absent for 3 or more consecutive days we will require medical evidence in the form of a dated prescription or 'patient summary' from your GP. GP surgeries will print out a 'patient summary' for you for free.

Medical Appointments

Medical appointments made during school-time will affect your child's attendance. All medical appointments should therefore be made outside of school time whenever possible. For any appointments that have to be made during school time, we require evidence in the form of an appointment card or letter from a medical professional.

Medical appointments generally only take up a small part of the day. If your child has a medical appointment, we expect them to come to school **before and after** the appointment or this absence will be marked as 'unauthorised'.

If your child is not here for the register at 8.55am and 1.30pm, they will be marked absent even if the reason for this absence is a medical appointment. If they are in school at these times, they will receive their registration mark.

For children who have to attend hospital appointments, we are aware that these can take much longer than general GP or nurse appointments and so this may require a morning or afternoon's absence. If this is the case, please provide the school office with your appointment letter from the hospital and we will take a copy for your child's file.

First Aid for Babies and Children

Agnes Munday from Family Learning will be hosting a First Aid for Babies and Children course at school on Thursday 28th March, 9.15am -12.15pm. The course aims to teach parents and carers what to do in an emergency situation, including if a baby or child:

- becomes unconscious or stops breathing
- gets burned
- is choking
- is bleeding heavily
- has an asthma attack, or suffers from an anaphylactic shock
- has signs of meningitis
- fits with febrile convulsion
- goes into shock

The course costs $\pounds 20$ or is free to those who are unemployed or on a low income. If you are claiming a free place, you will need to bring ID and proof of benefits to show the course tutor on the day. If you are paying, you can make payment over the phone to Friends Centre in advance, or pay cash on the day. For more information or to register for a place, please contact the school office.
