Film Night

Thank you once again to our wonderful PTFA for organising a Film Night last Friday. It was a lovely event – great snacks, great film and great behaviour! We raised around $\pounds 200$ towards the school fund so we appreciate all your donations for this.

Attendance

It is our responsibility as a school to make you aware of the impact that poor school attendance will have upon your child's learning. There is a clear link between poor attendance and low attainment. If your child is not attending school **on time, every day** they will be unable to keep up with the rest of the class and their learning will be affected.

Being late to school can have a considerable impact over the whole school year:



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5 minutes late every day = 3 days of school lost a year 10 minutes late every day = 6.5 days of school lost a year 15 minutes late every day = 10 days of school lost a year 20 minutes late every day = 13 days of school lost a year 30 minutes late every day = 19 days of school lost a year

If your child arrives after the close of registers at 9.30am, they will receive an 'unauthorised' late mark – this is the same as an 'unauthorised absence'. If your child has six of these in any six week period, you will be referred to the Local Authority for a Fixed Penalty Notice.

If there are issues preventing your child coming to school, or making it difficult for your child to come to school on time, then please do make an appointment to speak to me about this. Once we know what these issues are, we can then try and work together to address them.

In Bumblebee Class in particular, children are learning phonics from the moment school starts at 8.55am. If they arrive after 9.15am, they miss most of their phonics learning for the day. If they miss these essential parts of learning, they will fall behind as they progress through the school.

Fire Safety Lessons

Pangolin Class and Koala Class had Fire lessons this week and very much enjoyed them. They learnt about a range of ways of keeping safe. One suggestion is that you make a home fire escape plan as a family, so everyone knows what do do in the unlikely event of a fire. 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Own It App + Mobile Phones

Please can we remind parents that your child should only be bringing in a mobile phone to school if they are in Years 5 and 6 and are making their own way to or from school. If your child is younger, there is no need for them to have their phone in school.

The BBC have introduced the 'Own It' app – a software application that your child can download onto their smartphone, designed to support their digital wellbeing and help them to make smarter and better informed choices. Using a combination of self-reporting and 'machine learning', the app builds up a picture of your child's digital wellbeing and serves relevant content, information and interventions designed to help your child understand the impact that their online behaviours can have on themselves, and on others.
