## St Bartholomew's CE Primary School: PE and Sport Premium Funding, 2016 – 17

## **Background and Rationale**

The **PE and sports premium** is additional funding given to maintained primary schools and academies in England. It is targeted at improving the provision of physical education and sport, leading to improvements in:

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy lifestyles;
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement;
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport.

The amount received by schools is dependent on the number of children on roll. In the 2016 - 2017 academic year, St Bartholomew's School is receiving £8,842.

At St Bartholomew's we believe that all children should experience regular high quality PE and sports activities, as this helps to promote self-confidence, social inclusion and a healthy lifestyle. These qualities enhance children's learning both in and out of the classroom. We are committed to ensuring that in addition to their regular PE and sports activities, children are educated about healthy lifestyles and have opportunities to try out different sports, be coached by trained coaches and take part in competitions.

The school provides a minimum of two PE or sports sessions every week, as well as offering a wide range of free after school sports activities for many age groups which increase pupil participation in sporting activities.

Physical activities at St Bartholomew's cover a wide range and include athletics, dance, gymnastics, swimming, yoga and outdoor education. After school clubs include basketball, football, girls' football and karate. A high quality programme has been designed to meet the needs, abilities and interests of our children, and the opportunities provided aim to develop pupils' knowledge, understanding and skills and give them a positive attitude towards sport and physical activity.

We believe that taking part is more important than winning, and we encourage sporting attitudes as well as individual talents. We also encourage the social and individual qualities needed for both team and individual activities: the acceptance of responsibility, loyalty and co-operation, determination, tolerance and the enjoyment of success as well as simply taking part.

The PE and sports premium funding is targeted primarily at:

- professional development in teaching PE and sports for staff;
- providing additional sporting opportunities, extra to the curriculum;
- providing additional specialist teaching within the curriculum;
- providing opportunities for pupils to enter competitions;
- promoting a healthy lifestyle.

## Plans for the use of PE and Sports Premium funding 2016 - 17

Funding: £8,842

We plan to use this funding to:

- contribute towards the salary cost of a specialist schools sports co-ordinator within the City Partnership of Schools, whose work will include providing professional development in teaching PE and sports for staff, organizing whole year group enrichment days across the Partnership and developing the use of our Sports Leaders;
- fund the services of two swimming coaches to work with all the Junior classes, to match swimming coaching more precisely to swimming ability and model skills for staff;
- provide at least three after school sports clubs, including opportunities for Key Stage 1 pupils;
- provide opportunities for pupils to be involved in more intra-school and inter-school competitive sports activities;
- provide some additional specialist teaching within the curriculum for the youngest pupils.
