School News

Attendance

Attendance continues to be a concern at St. Bartholomew's CE Primary School – thank you to all parents and carers who make sure their pupils are in school on time every day and are accessing as much learning as they can.

Currently, we have 22 pupils who are either now either already classed as a persistent absentee or who are at risk of becoming one. Persistent absentees are pupils who have attendance of less that 90% - this means they are missing, on average, at least a day a fortnight. That's a lot of learning to miss and is not acceptable. Please ensure your child is in school, on time, every day to ensure that they make good progress in their learning.

Holidays are not allowed in term time. All holidays that are taken will result in the family being issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice which has to be paid within 28 days. If this is not paid, the fine doubles. If it is still not paid, it is likely go to court and parents may get a criminal record.

Parents Forum

At the recent Parent Forum, we discussed Home Learning. We discussed what homework worked well for families and schools, the advantages and disadvantages to having homework and rewards and sanctions around homework. It was an informative discussion and gave us some good points to think about when devising our new homework policy, which we hope will be ready for September.

Our next parents Forum will be on Tuesday 17th March and we will be discussing how to involve you as parents in the life of the school. Please come to the school office, ready to start at 2.30pm.

Brighton and Hove Unemployed Centre Families Project

The Brighton and Hove Unemployed Centre Families Project has been running for nearly 40 years and has been supporting families with low incomes in many ways over that time. They can give help and support around benefits, provide childcare for parents who are using the centre, provide a low cost vegan meal every day at 1pm (£1.50 for a large meal, 60p for a small), food education, computer support and a wide range of affordable or free courses.
