<p>Watch a video and research online and find out all about the Easter story. Can you write a fact file with at least 5 important facts about the Easter story? Present this as a poster, in a leaflet or you could even get your parents to film you presenting it as a news report!</p> <hr/> <p>Write and draw your own comic strip to tell your own Easter Story. Which characters will you include and what adventure will they go on. Try to include adjectives, interesting verbs and careful punctuation.</p> <hr/> <p>Write some clues to make an Easter Egg Hunt for your family! In your clues can you include riddles, codebreakers and picture clues?</p> <hr/> <p>Bake some yummy Easter cakes or cookies with your family. Use scales to measure out your ingredients and follow the recipe carefully. You could even get your grown up to film you like you're in a baking show! Send us pictures of your finished cakes.</p> <hr/> <p>Write an Easter themed acrostic poem. Challenge yourself to use grouped adjectives, rhyme and similes.</p>	<p>Create your own Easter cards for different members of your family. Challenge yourself to include a pop out element or a lever that moves. Email us a copy of your design.</p> <hr/> <p>Create an Easter quiz for your family (or even your teacher!) to solve. Think about the Easter Story and how people celebrate Easter around the world.</p> <hr/> <p>Draw or paint a picture of the Easter bunny. Make your image as detailed as possible. You could practise mixing your colours to make different tones.</p> <hr/> <p>Decorate your own hard-boiled egg using paints or felt tips so that it looks like a famous book or film character. Can you create a land for them to live in too?</p> <hr/> <p>Create a bunny using origami. What other animals can you make? Find some tutorials online to help you. Share your origami designs with us.</p>	<p>Design and create your own Easter word search or puzzle for a member of your family to complete and solve.</p> <hr/> <p>Design a brand new Easter egg! What flavour chocolate would you use? What shape would your Easter egg be? What would the packaging of your Easter egg look like?</p> <hr/> <p>Using the Year 2 Common Exception Words can you create a new board game to help you practise these? You could make a game of spelling snap, spelling snakes and ladders or even spelling Uno! Play your game with your family.</p> <hr/> <p>Create your own set of Top Trump cards that you can play with your family. Choose a topic that interests you.</p> <hr/> <p>Write up your favourite Easter jokes in your best handwriting. Film yourself telling your jokes and email it to us – let's make everyone smile</p>	<p>Create an Easter Egg hunt in your back garden or in your house. Make sure to get the whole family involved!</p> <hr/> <p>Go on GoNoodle and complete a Zumba, Kidspop or BlazerFresh work out. (GoNoodle is free and you just need to sign up for an account) https://app.gonoodle.com/</p> <hr/> <p>Can you complete a jigsaw puzzle at home? Draw a picture and create your own puzzle by cutting it into pieces – who in your house can solve your puzzle the quickest?</p> <hr/> <p>Watch an Easter movie as a family!
