Eg, Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled pepper. Look at either of the photos on the next page. How many alliterative phrases can you write to describe the one you chose?</p> <hr/> <p>A shop sells apples for 12p each, bananas for 20p each and pears for 8p each. Look at these 3 shopping lists. What coin would you need to pay for each the shopping on the first list? The second? Third? Put one on a window sill where it will get lots of sun. Put the other in a cupboard where it will be kept in the dark. Predict which one will grow best. In a week, you should be able to see whether you were right. Don’t forget to water both seeds equally to keep the experiment fair!</p> <hr/> <p>A very famous artist named Van Gogh is well known for painting sunflowers with incredibly vibrant colours. You can draw any flower or plant, but choose one with amazing colours!</p> <hr/> <p>Put the finishing touches to the costume you’ve been making for the Children’s Parade at Home on Saturday.
