


These activities and ideas are based around the "Oliver's Vegetables" series by Vivian French.

Can you do some healthy sorting?









Your task is to sort the different foods into healthy and not healthy.

foods you might have as a treat. Have a look at vegetable glue to see what happens when you don't eat your healthy vegetables!



(Think about how we described these as AB at the beginning and now becoming more complex-AAB, ABCB...)



Many artists have been inspired by nature. Here is one by Andy Goldsworthy.



Talking Together

This memory game is based on you remembering all the items you bought by adding I more at a time.



It is called "I went to market" but you can change that to whatever shop you want! People tend to remember things if they are funny so experiment!

If you want to write things down that is an option if your memory needs some training! If you are in a group it sometimes helps to look at the person and what they have added to the list.



Play the game

Each person takes it in turns to add one more item to the list but they have to say all the items. Lets play!

Here is an example if 3 people were playing sat in a circle.

- I) I went to market and I bought a red apple.
- 2) I went to market and I bought a red apple and a big pear.
- 3) I went to market and I bought a red apple, a big pear and a donkey .
- I) I went to market and I bought a red apple, a big pear, a donkey and a pink pen.
- 2) I went to market and I bought a red apple, a big pear, a donkey, a pink pen and a dragon.
- 3) I went to market and I bought a red apple, a big pear, a donkey, a pink pen, a dragon and a jelly.


Counting correctly and making labels

Can you help him out?





Pick out fruit from your fruit bowl and give each of them a move like in the story!


