# **Welcome Back**

### **School Vision**

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# **Staffing Update**

We can outline these to parents at the meeting with parents from Puffin Class that will take place on Monday at 2.30pm. You will have already had a letter/message about this.

### **After School Clubs**

Thank you to all of those parents who have signed up through ParentPay for clubs. We have taken on board any feedback you have given and we'll make some changes where needed but on the whole, the process was very successful.

The children told us in assembly today what they have already enjoyed about their clubs this week! They are very excited about them. There are still spaces in some clubs and it's not too late to join! Please sign up through Parentpay – if it doesn't let you sign up, it means there are no places left at that club.

### **SchoolPing and Paper Letters**

Most school communication now happens via SchoolPing which is our messaging app. You may have noticed that you have been getting messages via SchoolPing about how well your child or the class are doing – there is no alternative way of sending these if you don't have SchoolPing. We also try not to give out paper copies of any letters – we will send a letter out soon so you can request paper copies if you need them though.

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Parents of Bumblebees do not currently have access to SchoolPing as there has been a problem uploading the details to it. ICT services and SchoolPing are rectifying this and we hope to have you up and running soon!

# **Parent Forum**

We are introducing a Parent Forum each half term. This is an opportunity for parents to discuss specific areas of school improvement, makes suggestions and work with staff to find solutions.
