



## Year 6 Learning Activities – Week One

Write a scary story of your own.</p> <p>Read 'Black Beauty' on Oxford Owls online.</p> <p>Read a favourite book and either: - Write a book review. - Draw your favourite scene - Draw and describe your favourite character. - Think of adjectives to describe a good or bad character.</p>

<p>Make a quiz for a family member linked to your times tables and division facts. For example, make a board game with challenge cards.</p> <p>Read the 'Little Miss Long Hair' written by Ulla, which is in your pack. Create and illustrate your own Little Miss or Mr Men book based on yourself. Have a look at the official website for some information.</p> <p><a href="https://www.mrmen.com/">https://www.mrmen.com/</a></p> 	<p>Turn a fruit or vegetable into a character: You could draw a fruit or vegetable and add features such as eyes, clothes, accessories or you could use an actual fruit or vegetable. **8** Use an old sock to create a puppet. Can you put on a puppet show for someone?



**9** Make a list of all the electrical items in each room of your home. Can you come up with any ideas to use less electricity?

**10** Design and make a homemade board game and play it with your family.



**11** Do something kind for someone. Can you pay them a compliment, make them something or help them with a task?



**12** Can you create a story bag? Find a bag and collect items to go in it that relate to a well known story. If you can't find an item, you could draw a picture to include.

**13** List making! Write a list of things that make you happy, things you're grateful for or things you are good at.



**14** Design and make an obstacle course at home or in the garden. How fast can you complete it?



**15** Can you invent something new? Perhaps a gadget or something to help people? Draw a picture or write a description.



**16** Keep moving! Make up a dance routine to your favourite song.



**17** Write a play script. Can you act it out to other people?



**18** Read out loud to someone. Remember to read with expression.



**19** Write a song or rap about your favourite subject.



**20** Get sketching! Find a photograph or picture of a person, place or object and sketch it.



**21** Junk modelling! Collect and recycle materials such as yoghurt pots, toilet rolls and boxes and see what you can create with them.

**22** Draw a map of your local area and highlight interesting landmarks.



**23** Write a postcard to your teacher. Can you tell them what you like most about their class?

**24** Draw a view. Look out of your window and draw what you see.



**25** Get reading! What would you most like to learn about? Can you find out more about it in books? Can you find a new hobby?
