Reminders and Notices Coronavirus Update

We are now in Tier 2 where strict distancing rules still apply. In Tier 2, households **cannot mix indoors**, apart from support bubbles. A maximum of six people can meet outdoors. Thank you to everyone who is wearing a face covering in the playground – we really appreciate it. Certainly, in the run up to Christmas we ask that EVERYONE who can, makes a concerted effort to wear one. There are some parents who have stickers or lanyards to show they are exempt which is really useful – it means that staff won't challenge them. You can download your own exemption card here –

Also, we are aware of some parents who are exempt but are trying their best to wear a covering – we know this isn't possible for everyone but we really appreciate those who are managing this.

Food Bank

Our food bank is still up and running – please do ask a member of staff if you need some food provided for your family. We have plenty to share and we understand that it can be very difficult for families at this time.

Uniform

Please can I remind parents that PE Kit should be in school colours where possible. Certainly, ALL children should be wearing a PE t-shirt in the correct team colour – ideally with the logo. 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Pupils are allowed to wear non-uniform when it is their birthday. However, what they wear must still be safe and practical for school and no jewellery except small studs if they have their ears pierced.

Missing Necklace

We still have a necklace that has gone missing in school – please check children's pockets, bedrooms etc. to see if it has come home by accident and return it to school ASAP. We are continuing to search at school.

Watches

Some children have been wearing smart watches to school. Like all items in school, please do not send in anything to valuable as we cannot be held responsible for them if they become lost or damaged. It is also important that any watches do not have the facility to take photos – this is a data protection issue. The watches should not connect to the Internet and should not be able to send or receive calls or messages.

Punctuality

Lately, we have seen an increase in children arriving late to school. Please can we remind all parents that you are required to make sure that your children arrive at school before registration at 8.55am. We have a 'soft start' to the school day, which means that children can go in to their classrooms from 8.45am. The learning begins at 8.45am.

Even if you are just a few minutes late to school, this can have a real impact on your child's learning, and on their day. Being late means your child can miss out on important instructions, find it harder to settle and it disrupts the rest of the class. And these minutes add up - for instance, being 15 minutes late every day would mean losing two whole weeks of learning by the end of the school year.

ParentPay

Dinner and Breakfast Club payments MUST be paid for in advance. Do not wait to pay in arrears AFTER dinner has been had. Please regularly check (once a week at least) that your ParentPay account is up to date.

If you will not be able to make a payment for ANY reason, please telephone the school office and we can set up a payment plan. Dinner and Breakfast Club attendance for the week is added to ParentPay on a Friday so please check on a Friday afternoon.

Please remember that the school has to cover any debts, meaning that we have less money to spend on your child's education. The amount of admin time it takes to chase debts also costs the school and means that we have to spend a significant amount of time in the office contacting parents to ask them to pay dinner money, Breakfast Club fees and for school trips. Please help us by paying for things in advance and on time or letting us know that you need support with this.

If you are regularly in debt on ParentPay for School Dinners and/or Breakfast Club, you will be asked to come in for a meeting to discuss it with me.
