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
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#### Year 4 Poetry Workshop

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### Reminders and Notices Walk to School Week

Next month, pupils across Brighton and Hove are encouraged to come to school in an 'active way' for one week. The week we have chosen is the final week of this half term: Monday 18th October – Friday 22nd October.

Despite the name of the week, pupils are not restricted to just walking to school. If pupils prefer, and have permission from home, they can also scoot, skate or cycle to school (as long as they wear a helmet). The aim of the week is simply to encourage pupils to be even more active and to make even healthier lifestyle choices.

For those pupils who, because of the distance they live from school, cannot walk from home, they can still participate by getting the bus and walking from their stop. Those who are really keen might even get off a stop earlier, so they walk that little bit further, if parents and carers have allowed this. Those who travel by car can take part by getting dropped off a little further than usual from school and walking the rest of the way.

All pupils who come to school in an active way for **all 5 of the days** will be entered into a **special draw**. Each class will receive two book vouchers and two cycling goody bags. Names of all active participants will be picked from a hat, by their class teacher.

We hope that your child will be able to participate in this event and we wish them the best of luck in the prize

#### Illness

If you OR your child have ANY of these 3 symptoms:

- I. Cough
- 2. Temperature
- 3. Change in sense of taste or smell

you must stay at home and arrange a Covid-19 test. Please inform the school office as soon as possible on 01273 692463 if this is the case. LFT test are ONLY for use if you have NO symptoms. If you have symptoms, you MUST arrange a PCR test.

We understand that at this time of year, children get colds. They are fine to come to school if they have a cold just not if they have a temperature or a new, persistent cough.

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#### **Absence**

If your child is unwell, it is your responsibility to call the office by 9.30am to give reasons for absence. If you do not call, we will try to contact you. If no contact is made, we will record the absence as unauthorised. If your child has 3 unauthorised absences in a 6 week period, you are likely to be referred for Fixed Penalty Notice which results in a £60 fine per child per parent.

We understand how difficult routine appointments are to get at the moment but children should not miss school for routine dentist, optician etc. appointments. If they need to see a GP but are well enough to come to school, these appointments should also be made outside school hours.

If your child does have an unavoidable appointment that must be taken in school time, please email or call the school office at least 24 hours in advance and show evidence of the appointment, such as the letter or text received. Please try to ensure your child is in school for the register at 8.55am and at 1.30pm, even if they do have an appointment.

#### **Asthma Card**

If your child has asthma, they must have an in-date asthma pump in school and you must complete an Asthma Card which is available to download from the school website - <a href="https://www.st-bartholomews.brighton-hove.sch.uk/web/asthma\_card/509838">https://www.st-bartholomews.brighton-hove.sch.uk/web/asthma\_card/509838</a>. If you are unable to print this yourself, please call the school office who will send a printed one home with your child. It is a requirement that you complete one of these.

#### Lunches

School dinners are available for every child and are prepared in a Covid-safe environment. The cost of meals is £2.20 per day and must be paid for through ParentPay. All children in Bumblebee, Puffin and Koala Class are entitled to free school meals every day. If you are in receipt of certain benefits, your child may be entitled to free school meals – please visit <a href="https://www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/content/children-and-education/schools/free-school-meals">https://www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/content/children-and-education/schools/free-school-meals</a> for more information and to apply. It's important to do this even if your child is in the infants as it also entitles your child to additional funding in school. If you need help applying, please email the school office on admin@st-bartholomews.brighton-hove.sch.uk.

If your child does bring a packed lunch in, please remember:

- Food should be part of a healthy, balanced diet
- No sweets or chocolate
- No nuts in any form
- No glass bottles or containers
- No fizzy drinks, including fizzy water.

We usually encourage children to bring their rubbish home in their lunchbox as you can then see what they have eaten. We understand that it can make for a messy lunchbox but it's important you know what they have and haven't eaten each day.

#### **Fidget Toys**

Children should not be bringing anything in from home to school, including fidget toys. Only children who have approval from Mrs Christie Davies should have a fidget toy in school. This fidget toy should be small, non-distracting to others and fit in the child's tray. Any fidget toys or other home belongings that are brought into school without permission may be confiscated for the remainder of the day. If items are confiscated, they will be kept with a member of the Senior Leadership Team and can only be collected by a parent/carer at the end of the day.



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#### **SchoolPing**

SchoolPing is our main method of communicating with parents. You will receive information about trips, visits, school events, newsletter and even occasional messages from your child's teacher about something they have done well!

Almost all parents are signed up to this service – thank you. However, only 55% of Pings that we send are actually read. Therefore, there are parents who are missing out on vital information and sometimes their children miss out too.

If you need help with SchoolPing, please contact the school office who may be able to guide you.

One thing we have noticed with SchoolPing is that depending on your phone settings, it MAY not send a notification every time a message is sent. It is therefore worth checking your settings and also checking a couple of times a day for messages.

#### **Nasal Flu Vaccinations**

Our flu vaccinations will take place on 15/10/21. You have been sent information and instructions on how to complete the online consent form for your child's flu vaccination via SchoolPing.
