Attendance

Pupil attendance is a key focus for our school. We have too many pupils missing too much school at the moment. On the ScholarPack Parents app, you will be able to see attendance data for your child. All children need to be aiming for 95% attendance or over – this is considered good attendance.

If your child's attendance is **BELOW 90**% they are considered a **persistent absentee**. This means our Attendance Officer may become involved but more importantly, your child is missing a day of school EVERY fortnight. This is TOO much learning and friendship to be missing.

However, we do appreciate there was a lot of illness around before Christmas and we do understand that sometimes children will be too ill to come to school, for example if they are being sick. But now, we are all going to work really hard together to get GREAT attendance this term.

Each day a class has a FULL HOUSE (all pupils being educated in a school setting), they will get class points which add up to result in a class reward! Please ensure your child comes to school as much as they can so they can learn and make friends!

Any problems, please do talk to your child's class teacher or a member of SLT.

PTFA

Our PTFA (Parent, Teachers and Friends Association) work together to create fundraising and fun opportunities for the school and its pupils. Our next meeting is on MONDAY at 2.30pm. Please come along and join us if you feel you can help out.



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Lunchboxes and Snacks

Children will be keeping their lunch on the lunchbox trolleys and their snack in their classroom, rather than in the cloakroom. This was what we always did before the pandemic but it is one of the things that changed for a while. However, having less things in the cloakroom works much better during the school day so we will be changing back to our original system. Therefore, it is REALLY important that your child's lunchbox, water bottle, tubs etc are clearly named.

Governors

We are looking to appoint new Parent Governor but also have vaccanices for Foundation Governors. Parent Governors need to be parents/carers of children who are currently in school and Foundation Governors can be parents/carers or anyone else who follows the Christian faith. We would also be interested in appointed Governors who refelct the diverse makeup of our school body.

Governors attend 6-8 meetings a year in the evenings and also take a role in monitoring school improvement. It can be a challenging role but it is also very interesting and rewarding.
