If you're finding it hard, have a look at what Years 3 or 4 are doing in the White Rose scheme. It is sometimes hard to complete work without teacher support and it is okay to try something easier. The most important thing is that you are doing some maths. Many of you will be getting lots and lots of extra help next year (because of missing so much of this year) so don't worry about closing any gaps. But it is still important that you keep using the mathematical part of your brain in the meantime, though!

Similarly, if you find the Year 5 work too easy, have a look at the White Rose sheets Year 6 are being set. Some of you often complete challenges set at this level and achieve well with complete independence in class on a regular basis.

If you are finding the home learning programme too overwhelming, try and complete just a little maths and English each week and send any photos of work completed.
