

Year 5 are also participating in the Soundmakers project this term. This is a fabulous opportunity for everyone to learn to play the guitar in this opportunity which is part funded by the school and part funded by Soundmakers. Black History Month

As part of Black History Month, Jaguar Class had a VERY exciting (fully funded) opportunity to go to Brighton and Hove Albion's training ground in Lancing to meet some players as part of the No Room for Racism initiative. They were able to ask questions to Robert Sanchez, Joel Veltman and Danielle Carter all who play for Brighton and Hove Albion. The players all said they had seen racism in football both from players and fans. The children carefully planned their questions beforehand so the opportunity wasn't wasted!

Their questions were:

Has the colour of your skin ever affected your football? How quickly does the FA deal with reports of racism?



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Have you ever experienced racism on the pitch?

Do you think that more can be done by the media to tackle racism?

Should harder sanctions be taken against fans who are openly racist, for example booing when taking the knee. Would harder sanctions be helpful?

How are you and your family protected from racism in your everyday life?

"We talked about the mosaics and paintings and stained glass windows. We went up the stairs to the pulpit and were allowed to light candles." Dominika



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
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Gully's Health Squad

Reminders and Notices

Harvest

Next Thursday, we will have our Harvest Mass and would love for as many parents/carers as possible to attend. Please meet your child's class at the school office and accompany them down to the church. This for children from Year 2 - 6.

We would ask that as many children as possible bring in some Harvest gifts that will be shared between our school foodbank and the City Mission foodbank. Next Thursday, please bring in any of the following: pasta, cereal bars, tinned fruit, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, long life milk, juice cartons, squash, crisps, pre-packaged and long life bakery products (croissants, brioche, muffins, cakes, flapjacks), biscuits, pasta sauces, rice, curry sauce, instant noodle pots, instant porridge pots, cereal, tinned pasta, tinned beans, custard, rice puddings, packet desserts.

Dogs

Dogs are not allowed on the school premises, including the playground. Please do not bring dogs into the school building or playground at all. If you do, you will be asked to leave your dog outside.



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Parents' Evening

This is a new system that we are using to book Parents' Evening. You will need to enter your email address, name, phone number and your child's name. You will then be emailed confirmation of your booking. This should hopefully be straightforward but please do contact the school office if you are having trouble making a booking. Parents' Evening will take place in the school hall. Please access the hall via the Breakfast Club entrance (the green door opposite Sainsbury's) and ensure that you arrive promptly for your appointment.

Please remember that your child is your responsibility during Parents' Evening, and must not be left unsupervised. We hope that you will use this opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher.

Breakfast Club and Dinner Money Payment

Please ensure breakfast club and dinner money is paid **in advance** of your child attending breakfast club or having a school dinner. If it is not, you will be regularly contacted by the school office to recover the debt. We understand that talking about money can be difficult but please do also be polite to office staff if they are following up the debt.

Any debt comes out of the school budget which means there is less money to spend on your child's education. As always, if you are struggling with money, please do come and speak to us. We still have our foodbank up and running so please let us know if you need to access this.

If you are taking the opportunity to have a bit of a clear out, we would gratefully receive any donations of:

- Clean underwear (used for children who may have an accident we have spent a lot of money on underwear for pupils this year)

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


Uniform
